

Housing Information and Support for Older LGBTIQA+ People



Being included

Housing for the Aged Action Group (HAAG) welcomes all members of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex & Asexual (LGBTIQA+) communities to access our housing services, to participate in our organisation and our campaigns for housing justice, and to work with us.

Our services are available for Victorians aged 50 and older, and for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people 45 and older. We welcome people of all cultural backgrounds, abilities, ethnicities, gender identities, intersex variations, sexual orientations and religious beliefs.

You don't have to disclose your gender or sexuality to receive inclusive support from HAAG, our team can help you access housing information and support no matter what your background.

We all need secure and affordable housing to be safe and healthy as we age. That's why we provide information and support for people who need help finding a home they can afford, help finding Aged Care, and help with issues in private rental and Retirement Housing.

Getting involved

Older LGBTIQA+ people in the private rental market face increased risks and are more likely to be at risk compared to non-LGBTIQA+ older people. 60% of LGBTIQA+ older people do not know where to go for help and information about their housing options. Reliance on informal support networks coupled with historical discrimination leaves older LGBTIQA+ people vulnerable to homelessness.
