

Professionals and providers/services: Tell us what you think the Aged Care Action Plan for older people experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness should address

The Minister for Senior Australians and Aged Care, the Hon Ken Wyatt AM MP, has commissioned an action plan under the Aged Care Diversity Framework for older people experiencing, or at risk of homelessness (the Homelessness Action Plan). This is part of the work towards realising the Aged Care Diversity Framework's vision that "All older people experience a high-quality aged care system that ensures equitable access and outcomes and embraces their diverse characteristics and life experiences". The Diversity Sub-group of the Aged Care Sector Committee is responsible for development of the Homelessness Action Plan. Housing for the Aged Action Group (HAAG) is working with a Reference Group and the Diversity Sub-group to develop the Homelessness Action Plan.

Which clients are considered to be experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness?

If an older person is experiencing any of the following then they are considered at risk of homelessness or experiencing homelessness and this might affect the aged care services they can receive or want to receive:

- Renting a home with no guarantee they can stay there as long as they like
- Renting a home that is too expensive, in poor condition, or not suitable for ageing
- Living with friends or family because they don't have a place of their own
- Living somewhere they don't feel safe and secure, for example due to threats and violence
- Living in housing that is meant to be temporary, like a boarding house, shelter or hostel
- Living in a house that is overcrowded and where they have no privacy
- Living in housing that is inadequate, like a caravan
- Don't have a place to stay and are sleeping in their car or on the streets

Did you know: A person is eligible for aged care if they are aged 50 years or older (or 45 years or older for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people) and are prematurely aged, on a low income, and are experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness.

We want to hear from all professionals, providers and services who work with older people, even those that are not specialised in providing services to people experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness.

This survey closes Friday 8 February 2019. All responses will be treated in the strictest confidence and your responses will never be linked to your identity. The information provided will only be reported in a de-identified group format.
