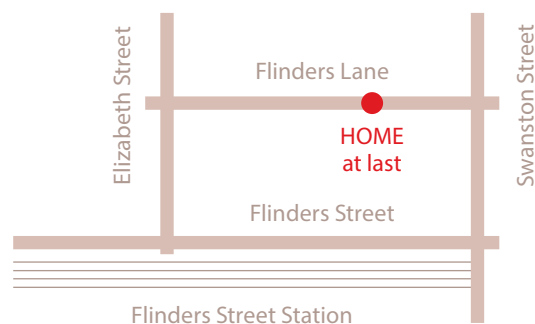

Housing information and support for older people

Do you need assistance to find affordable housing?

Home at Last is a free service that provides confidential advice, support and advocacy for people aged 50 years and older to assist them to find housing. Home at Last is available to any older person in Victoria on a low income. We will provide one-to-one assistance to you, or link you into a service that can help.

Our service includes:

- Information about affordable housing options
- Support for people at risk of homelessness to obtain Public Housing, Community Housing, and other low cost retirement housing options
- Advice and advocacy for people living in retirement housing
- Assistance to register for aged care support and system navigation
- Referring you to get help with tenancy issues.

Home at Last is a service provided by Housing for the Aged Action Group (HAAG)

Who is Housing for the Aged Action Group?

HAAG is committed to the principles of social justice and aims to ensure every individual is treated with dignity and respect regardless of their age, cultural background, ability, ethnicity, gender identity, sexual orientation, intersex variation, or religion.

HAAG is a community group with a membership base of older people. We welcome new members to join. You can volunteer, or join one of our campaigns for housing justice.
